I see customers who reminisce about how you' looked after their dog or cat or cow. Did you enjoy those days working in practice?

Half of my career was as a practitioner, I always tell students that the secret of enjoying being a practitioner is more about loving people than loving animals although that's important too. My clients had animals in need of attention and my job, whether the patient was a dog, cat, horse or cow was to try to fix the problem but more importantly, manage those owners' expectations. Having a passion for people made being a vet just the best job - ever.

When did you find out that you'd received an OBE?

I was shocked and humbled to receive a letter from the Cabinet Office about 5 weeks before the announcement - and being sworn to secrecy!

What are you currently working on?

My days are pretty full and I currently work as a volunteer with 3 charities - the Samaritans, Vetlife which is like Samaritans ++ for the veterinary profession and my busiest role is as chair of VetSupport which helps those in the veterinary profession who are struggling with pressure, stress or anxiety to manage those mental health pressures better through coaching.

Do you feel veterinary medicine is in a good place as a profession?

The veterinary degree is a fabulous problem-solving qualification. Graduates can go in all sorts of directions. The opportunities constantly change over time and I believe the future of the profession is bright - so I am involved in the setting up of a new initiative in Belfast - a new independent referral clinical staffed by a team of veterinary specialists.

SUNGLASSES EVENT

We held a sunglasses event in Coleraine and I thought I'd highlight 6 key take aways from that presentation.

Did you know your eyes are 10 times more sensitive than your skin?

- 2. The earlier we protect our eyes the better. Exposure is cumulative.
- 3. UV index above 3 can damage our skin, especially strongest around midday.
- 4. SPF for the skin, look at sunglasses as your eye SPF
- 5. Cataracts, Age Related Degeneration, Skin cancers are linked with UV exposure
- 6. Non-CE certified sunglasses are worse for the eyes than none at all.
